MISSISSIPPI

The Southaven Police Department requests to use funds from the Jag 2016 grant to purchase the following items;

140 Individual Patrol Officer Trauma Kits. Trauma Kit contains; Tourniquet, gauze, pair of latex gloves and pouch, to issue to each officer to have an immediate means to self treat a traumatic penetrating wound until arrival of medical assistance at \$ 6,300.00

20 Trauma Kits for SWAT. Kits contains Tourniquet, gauze, latex gloves, air seal gauze to issue to each SWAT member to allow means to self treat a traumatic penetrating wound until arrival of medical assistance at \$ 2,800.00

One (1) Level III (rifle capable) large ballistic shield fro SWAT. SWAT has no ballistic shields that are capable of stopping rifle fire and this will replace out dated shield with lower capability, at \$ 5,000.00

Three (3) Portable Intoximeters Alco-Sensors FST and mouth peices. To provide officers with field results of suspected DUI drivers at \$ 1,784.00

Two (2) Hand held Radars used to replace two damaged units at \$ 2,000.00

45 Nightstick brand LED safety lights (traffic directing wands) to be utilized by officers to direct traffic at accident scenes, special events and road closures. This will supply the remaining officers that do not have this equipment at \$ 1,572.75

One (1) GETAC Ruggedized Laptop computer for Public Relations to be utilized in teaching, public presentations and community events. This Laptop needs to be ruggedized as it will also be utilized in outdoor activities, specifically in our Children's Fingerprinting program where we fingerprint children utilizing a device similar to Live Scan, and we print and give the parents a copy of their child's fingerprints for safe keeping. We currently purchase Getac Ruggedized for other uses and they have the specifications needed to communicate with our RMS/CAD systems at \$ 4,100.00

Ten (10) portable barricades for traffic control purposes at \$ 974.50
