BE IT REMEMBERED that the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Southaven, Mississippi met in a Special Called Meeting on the 2nd day of December, 2021 at nine o'clock (9:00) a.m. at City Hall.

Also present were Mayor Musselwhite, Andrea Mullen, City Clerk, and Nick Manley, City Attorney. Approximately three (3) other people were present.

BankPlus Amphitheater

Mayor Musselwhite stated that the Snowden Grove Amphitheater Improvements Bid will be on the upcoming December 7 meeting agenda for approval. Mayor Musselwhite presented the bid tabulation and provided different scenarios on how to fund the project. Mayor Musselwhite made the recommendation to award the bid to Murphy & Sons, the lowest and best base bid, in the amount of 10,326,773.00. Assuming that the Board would decide to go with all improvements along with the design fee, the total project cost would be \$11,886,300.00. Mayor Musselwhite also made the recommendation to do a low term with a fifteen (15) year bond to fund the project. There was much discussion among the Mayor and Board as it relates to funding and the necessity to move forward with all improvements as it would cost more to do them at a later date. It was also noted that the two key factors to consider is the low interest rate offered and inflation. No action was taken.

There being no further business to come before the Board of Aldermen, a motion was made by Alderman Flores to adjourn. Motion was seconded by Alderman Wheeler. Motion was put to a vote and passed unanimously December 2, 2021 at 9:50 a.m.
