Also present were Mayor Musselwhite, Andrea Mullen, City Clerk, and Nick Manley, City Attorney. Approximately twenty (20) other people were present. Mayor Musselwhite called the meeting to order. Alderman Gallagher led in prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Alderman Payne.

Next, a motion was made by Alderman Payne to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of June 7, 2022 with any corrections, deletions, or additions necessary. Motion was seconded by Alderman Hoots. Motion was put to a vote and passed unanimously.

#### STACY DODD, VERTAVA HEALTH

Mr. Dodd gave an update on the Hope Center and stated that they mentor students in grades 5<sup>th</sup>-7<sup>th</sup> in group and one on one settings. Their goal is to build confidence and self-esteem and promote leadership to help students grow into productive young adults. Mr. Dodd stated that they are working with the Memphis Grizzlies, Desoto County Schools, and Brown Missionary Church. Mayor Musselwhite thanked Mr. Dodd for all that he is doing in the community.

# AGREEMENT WITH DESOTO COUNTY CONVENTION AND VISITORS BUREAU

Nick Manley, City Attorney, presented this item to the Board.

Mr. Manley stated that the City previously entered into an Agreement with DCCVB to assist with booking, producing, staffing events at the BankPlus Amphitheater. Initially, the Agreement was for one (1) year. Todd Mastry, who will be performing the services on behalf of the DCCVB, met with the Mayor to discuss the issue of procuring the largest financial share of ticketing fees from

Ticketmaster as possible. Ticketmaster informed Todd Mastry that they would need to have a 48 month minimum contract for the services, so Ticketmaster can begin to build the seating manifest and ISM as soon as possible, as promoters are already holding dates and will begin to enter negotiation stages in preparation for the 2023 outdoor concert season. The contract is for a four (4) year term with a sixty (60) day termination for convenience clause. Alderman Wheeler made the motion to approve the contract. Motion was seconded by Alderman Payne.

#### RESOLUTION FOR BUDGET AMENDMENT

Nick Manley, City Attorney, presented this item to the Board.

# RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF SOUTHAVEN, MISSISSIPPI TO AMEND FY 2022 BUDGET

The Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Southaven, Mississippi (the "City"), considered the matter of amending the 2022 City Budget.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Miss. Code 21-35-25, the City desires to amend its 2022 budget; and

WHEREAS, the City Governing Authorities desire to reflect the funds for the grant money received for roads and insurance to replenish police vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the transfer from fund to fund, or from item to item, will not result in the expenditure of any money for a purpose different from that which was budgeted or collected; and

#### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- The City Board approves the budget amendment as set forth in Exhibit A and authorizes the Mayor or his designee to take any and all actions for such amendment.
- 2. If required, the City is authorized to publish within two (2) weeks of this action in the same manner as the final adopted budget. This publication shall contain a description of the amendment, the amount of money and funds affected, and a detailed statement explaining the need and purpose of the amendment. The vote of each member of the municipality's governing authority on each amendment shall be included in the publication or posted notice.
- 3. The Mayor or his designee are authorized to take all actions to further effectuate the intent of this Resolution.
