Also present were Mayor Musselwhite, Andrea Mullen, City Clerk and Nick Manley, City Attorney. Approximately twenty (20) other people were present.

Mayor Musselwhite called the meeting to order. Alderman Flores led in prayer, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance led by Alderman Ferguson.

Mayor Musselwhite explained that the Board of Alderman recently authorized him to meet with the individual contractors to negotiate the scope of work and price for the landscape maintenance services contracts. Mayor Musselwhite stated that he received updated proposals that were broken down into general right of ways, manicured right of way / grounds maintenance, and chemical spraying. Mayor Musselwhite stated that it is his recommendation to award the general right of ways contract to Reel Neet Erosion Control / Reel Neet Lawn Services, LLC in the amount of \$204,000.00, manicured right of ways / grounds maintenance contract to BLC of Mississippi, LLC in the amount of \$432,000.00 and the chemical spraying contract to Green King Spray Services, LLC in the amount of \$116,000.00.

Alderman Brooks made the motion to open into discussion. Motion was seconded by Alderman Kite.

Next, Alderman Brooks expressed his concerns with the quality of service that the City has experienced with Reel Neet in the past and stated that they should have BLC of Mississippi as a secondary contractor in the event that they are not satisfied with Reel Neet's services. Mayor Musselwhite explained that he will be directly involved with all of the contractors to ensure that quality is met and if there was ever an issue, he would bring a recommendation to the Board to change contractors.

Alderman Brooks made the motion to approve the lawn maintenance contracts and authorized Mayor Musselwhite to sign each contract. Motion was seconded by Alderman Flores.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT BETWEEN SOUTHAVEN AND REEL NEET EROSION CONTROL/REEL NEET LAWN . SERVICES, INC.

This AGREEMENT made and entered into on this, the <u>31</u> day of May, 2016, by and between the CITY OF SOUTHAVEN, MISSISSIPPI, of 8710 Northwest Drive, Southaven, DeSoto County, Mississippi, hereinafter referred to as "CITY," and REEL NEET EROSION CONTROL/REEL NEET LAWN SERVICES, INC. "CONTRACTOR."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Section 65-1-75 of the Mississippi Code Annotated (1972) specifically places the responsibility in a municipality to mow the grass of areas beyond the curb lines on highways or streets located within the municipal corporate limits; and

WHEREAS, CITY desires to contract with CONTRACTOR to mow and remove the trash of certain right of ways within the CITY; and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR desires to contract with CITY to provide such services for the CITY; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to set forth the terms and conditions of this Agreement in writing; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, benefits and obligations set forth in this Agreement, the parties agree as follows, to-wit:

SECTION ONE SCOPE OF WORK

CONTRACTOR shall provide all services in accordance with and as set forth in Exhibit A. CONTRACTOR shall provide its own equipment and materials necessary to for such work. The CITY reserves the right to modify areas, quantities, intervals and number of activities of work covered under this contract without penalty at the unit price provided for in this contract. In the event that the CONTRACTOR is unable to provide the services needed by the CITY, the CITY reserves the right to immediately cancel this contract or allow for another contractor to complete the work.

SECTION TWO CONTRACT PRICE

CITY shall pay CONTRACTOR to perform the work in the amount of \$25,500.00 for the completion of the cutting of all right of ways and other duties as set forth in Exhibit A. CONTRACTOR shall not exceed eight (8) cutting rotations on an annual basis, unless authorized by CITY. Upon CONTRACTOR's completion of all services as it relates to all properties and duties listed in Exhibit A, CONTRACTOR shall provide a detailed invoice and description of work and equipment, prior to receiving compensation from the CITY. Payment by owner shall be due within thirty (30) days of invoicing. Should the CITY require additional work to be performed, all such work will become a part of this contract.

SECTION THREE INDEMNITY AND INSURANCE

CONTRACTOR agrees to indemnify and hold harmless CITY, its elected officials, agents, employees, assigns and legal representatives from and against all damages, accidents and injuries to persons or properties caused by CONTRACTOR, its agents, employees or

temporary employees or resulting from or in conjunction with CONTRACTOR cleaning such properties for CITY. This Section of this Agreement shall be deemed to survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall provide liability and automobile insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence with confirmation thereof to be delivered to CITY prior to commencement of services. CONTRACTOR shall provide worker's compensation and employer's liability insurance at a minimum of \$100,000 per accident. The CITY shall be listed as an additional insured on all policies and any change in insurance shall be communicated to the CITY. All equipment shall be provided to the City and be insured and confirmation provided to the CITY.

SECTION FOUR TERM AND TERMINATION

This Agreement shall become effective upon signature by both parties and shall expire on December 31, 2018, with renewal solely at the CITY option. Either party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement for convenience upon said party giving written notice to the other party ten (10) days in advance. However, the CITY shall have the right to immediately terminate the contract upon CONTRACTOR'S failure to submit accurate invoices.

SECTION FIVE ASSIGNMENT

This Agreement shall not be assignable by either party without the prior written consent of the other party.

SECTION SIX ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter of the contract and supersedes and cancels any and all prior oral or written

contracts or understandings between the parties with respect to the matters set forth above. The Agreement may be changed and modified only in writing signed by all parties hereto. The Exhibit attached hereto is specifically made a part of this Agreement.

SECTION SEVEN EFFECT OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall inure to the benefit and be binding on the parties, heirs, legal representatives, assignees and successors of the parties.

SECTION EIGHT GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Mississippi. The parties shall use good faith efforts to resolve any disputes hereunder. Jurisdiction and venue for all disputes hereunder shall be proper in the federal and state courts having competent jurisdiction in Desoto County, Mississippi.

SECTION NINE INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

CONTRACTOR acknowledges it is an independent contractor and is neither an employee of CITY nor entitled to the same or similar benefits provided to employees of CITY. This Agreement reflects an arms-length transaction. Nothing in this Agreement creates a fiduciary, partnership, joint venture or employment or other agency relationship among the parties. This Agreement is not entered into for the benefit of, nor are any rights granted to, any third party except as expressly provided herein. In this respect, Contractor further acknowledges it is solely responsible for certain obligations, including but not limited to any and all taxes, withholding and workers compensation.

PROFESSIONAL SERIVCES AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF SOUTHAVEN AND BLC OF MISSISSIPPI, LLC

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Section 21-19-11 of the Mississippi Code Annotated (1972) authorizes the governing authority of any municipality to clean private property if the governing authority shall adjudicate the property to be a menace to the public health and safety of the community.

WHEREAS, Section 21-19-11 of the Mississippi Code Annotated (1972) authorizes the governing authority of any municipality to clean the property by the use of municipal employees or by contract; and

WHEREAS, Section 65-1-75 of the Mississippi Code Annotated (1972) specifically places the responsibility in a municipality to mow the grass of areas beyond the curb lines on highways or streets located within the municipal corporate limits; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF SOUTHAVEN ("CITY") desires to maintain and cut the grass and weeds at its utility easements, MDOT right of ways, various CITY right of ways, and the training center utilized by the CITY Police and Fire Department.

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to contract with BLC OF MISSISSIPPI, LLC ("CONTRACTOR") to provide such services for the CITY; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to set forth the terms and conditions of this Agreement in writing; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, benefits and obligations set forth in this Agreement, the parties agree and ratify the previous Agreement as follows, to-wit:

SECTION ONE SCOPE OF WORK

In accordance with Mississippi Code 21-19-11, CONTRACTOR shall clean such private properties or land by cutting grass, weeds, and plants in an amount consistent with and with the equipment attached hereto as Exhibit A. In addition, CONTRACTOR shall provide all services in accordance with and as set forth in Exhibit B. CONTRACTOR shall provide its own equipment and materials necessary to clean such properties. The CITY reserves the right to modify areas, quantities, intervals and number of activities of work covered without penalty at the unit price provided for in this contract. In the event that the CONTRACTOR is unable to provide the services needed by the CITY, the CITY reserves the right to use a secondary contractor to complete the work required.

SECTION TWO CONTRACT PRICE

For those properties which are cut and/or cleaned by CONTRACTOR pursuant to Mississippi Code 21-19-11, CITY shall pay CONTRACTOR at the agreed upon rates attached hereto and marked as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference. For the services performed by CONTRACTOR as set forth in Exhibit B, CITY shall pay CONTRACTOR in the amount of \$36,000.00 per month. CONTRACTOR shall provide separate and detailed invoices for the services set forth in Exhibit A and Exhibit B and description of work, including units of hours and equipment, prior to receiving

compensation from the CITY. Payment by CITY shall be due within thirty (30) days of invoicing.



AS NEEDED AND APPROPRIATE, SUCH MATERIAL SHOULD BE BAGGED AND DISPOSED OF OFF SITE.
- 5. Remove weeds from common area beds as needed. Hand-pull large weeds and treat small sprouts with chemical as necessary.
- 6. Manicure all trees (up to 15 feet above ground), shrubs, etc. on: Public Works, City Hall, Police Department, Library, Northwest Drive, Getwell Lift Station to promote a neat and healthy appearance at least 2 times during a calendar year.
- 7. Advise property representative of dead shrubbery and planting materials and remove as necessary after consultation.
- 8. Advise property representative of dead trees and present proposal for removal if over 15 feet in height.
- 9. Manicure of shrubs will be done as needed, approximately every 6 weeks.
- 10. At a minimum spray "Round up" or equal product to kill weeds as needed along fence lines or other edges if properties receive no other spraying services and/or between treatments if needed for weed control.

Winter Services

Contractor agrees to perform the following services on a weekly basis (as weather permits) during non-growing season. The following treatments will be completed on all the same properties as listed above:

- 1. Removal of all trash and debris from property. Mow any lawn areas at a cutting height of 2.5" to 3" depending if unseasonable weather or other condition results in tall grass conditions or other unsatisfactory conditions. These mowing cuts will be above and beyond the 32 cuts and at the contractors' expense as required to keep the lawn in a presentable condition. In no circumstances will contractor be required to cut the lawn more than once per week.
- 2. Edge around all drives, walks, and curbs weekly so that edges are neat and free of any overgrowth.
- 3. Trim around all trees, fences, buildings, etc. as may be required if initial cut with mower does not present an even, neat appearance.
- 4. Removal of all clippings or cuttings from drives, walks, and curbs and will dispose of properly off site. Contractor will not leave dense pile of clippings or cuttings in any area of the property. ALL SUCH MATERIAL IS NOT TO BE BLOWN OFF INTO ANY PAVED

AREAS WHERE IT COULD FIND ITS WAY INTO THE STORM SEWER SYSTEM. AS NEEDED AND APPROPRIATE, SUCH MATERIAL SHOULD BE BAGGED AND DISPOSED OF OFF SITE.

- 5. Remove weeds from common area beds as needed. Hand-pull large weeds and treat small sprouts with chemical as necessary.
- 6. Prune all trees (up to 15 feet above ground), shrubs, etc., as needed to promote a neat and healthy appearance at least monthly.

ALL TRASH AND DEBRIS COLLECTED MAY BE DUMPED IN THE CITY'S TRUCK PARKED AT THE NORTH END OF THE PARKING LOT AT THE ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES FACILITY AT 5813 PEPPER CHASE DRIVE.
- 2. Edge around all streets, walks, and curbs so that edges are neat and free of any overgrowth.
- 3. Remove all grass and weeds growing through streets, walks, curbs, and intersection islands.
- 4. Trim around all natural and built structures as may be required if initial cut with mower does not present an even, neat appearance.
- 5. Removal of all clippings or cuttings from drives, walks, and curbs and will dispose of promptly off site. Contractor will not leave dense pile of clippings or cuttings in any area of the property. ALL SUCH MATERIAL IS NOT TO BE BLOWN OFF INTO ANY PAVED AREAS WHERE IT COULD FIND ITS WAY INTO THE STORM SEWER SYSTEM. AS NEEDED AND APPROPRIATE, SUCH MATERIAL SHOULD BE BAGGED AND DISPOSED OF OFF SITE.
- 6. Advise City representative of dead trees or other conditions that might affect public health, safety and welfare.

PROFESSIONAL SERIVCES AGREEMENT BETWEEN CITY OF SOUTHAVEN AND GREEN KING SPRAY SERVICES, LLC

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Section 69-19-9 of the Mississippi Code Annotated (1972) requires that any person engaging in professional services, including but not limited to "weed control work" shall obtain a license from the Mississippi Department of Agriculture; and

WHEREAS, the CITY OF SOUTHAVEN ("CITY") desires to maintain the appearance of its property by preventing and eradicating weeds; and

WHEREAS, the CITY desires to contract with Green King Spray Services, LLC ("CONTRACTOR") to provide spraying professional services for the CITY as the CONTRACTOR has the required license and insurance required by the Mississippi Code and as provided the qualifications to the CITY; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to set forth the terms and conditions of this Agreement in writing; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, benefits and obligations set forth in this Agreement, the parties agree and ratify the previous Agreement as follows, to-wit:

SECTION ONE SCOPE OF WORK

CONTRACTOR shall provide spraying services for the locations by providing the chemicals for the locations as set forth Exhibit A. CONTRACTOR shall provide its

own equipment and materials necessary to clean such properties. The CITY reserves the right to modify areas, quantities, intervals and number of activities of work covered without penalty at the unit price provided for in this contract. In the event that the CONTRACTOR is unable to provide the services needed by the CITY, the CITY reserves the right to use a secondary contractor to complete the work required.

SECTION TWO CONTRACT PRICE

CITY shall pay CONTRACTOR to perform the aforementioned services with the required chemicals as set forth in Exhibit A in the amount of \$8,343.00 per month. CONTRACTOR shall provide a detailed invoice and description of work, including equipment, prior to receiving compensation from the CITY. Payment by CITY shall be due within thirty (30) days of invoicing. Should the CITY require additional work to be performed, all such work will become a part of this contract.

SECTION THREE INDEMNITY AND INSURANCE

CONTRACTOR agrees to indemnify and hold harmless CITY, its elected officials, agents, employees, assigns and legal representatives from and against all damages, accidents and injuries to persons or properties caused by CONTRACTOR, its agents, employees or temporary employees or resulting from or in conjunction with CONTRACTOR cleaning such properties for CITY. This Section of this Agreement shall be deemed to survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement. CONTRACTOR shall provide liability and automobile insurance in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 per occurrence with confirmation thereof to be delivered to CITY prior to commencement of services. CONTRACTOR shall provide worker's

compensation and employer's liability insurance at a minimum of \$100,000 per accident. The CITY shall be listed as an additional insured on all policies and any change in insurance shall be communicated to the CITY. All equipment shall be provided to the City and be insured and confirmation provided to the CITY.

SECTION FOUR TERM AND TERMINATION

This Agreement shall become effective upon signature by both parties and shall expire on December 31, 2018, with renewal solely at the CITY option. Either party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement for convenience upon said party giving written notice to the other party ten (10) days in advance. However, the CITY shall have the right to immediately terminate the contract upon CONTRACTOR'S failure to submit accurate invoices.

SECTION FIVE ASSIGNMENT

This Agreement shall not be assignable by either party without the prior written consent of the other party.

SECTION SIX ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement contains the entire understanding of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter of the contract and supersedes and cancels any and all prior oral or written contracts or understandings between the parties with respect to the matters set forth above. This Agreement may be changed and modified only in writing signed by all parties hereto. The Exhibit attached hereto is specifically made a part of this Agreement.

SECTION SEVEN EFFECT OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall inure to the benefit and be binding on the parties, heirs, legal representatives, assignees and successors of the parties.

SECTION EIGHT GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Mississippi. The parties shall use good faith efforts to resolve any disputes hereunder. Jurisdiction and venue for all disputes hereunder shall be proper in the federal and state courts having competent jurisdiction in Desoto County, Mississippi.

SECTION NINE INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

CONTRACTOR acknowledges it is an independent contractor and is neither an employee of CITY nor entitled to the same or similar benefits provided to employees of CITY. This Agreement reflects an arms-length transaction. Nothing in this Agreement creates a fiduciary, partnership, joint venture or employment or other agency relationship among the parties. This Agreement is not entered into for the benefit of, nor are any rights granted to, any third party except as expressly provided herein. In this respect, CONTRACTOR further acknowledges it is solely responsible for certain obligations, including but not limited to any and all taxes, withholding and workers compensation.
