#### RESOLUTION OF CITY OF SOUTHAVEN REQUESTING LEGISLATION DESIGNATING THE GEORGE E. GUERIERI, SR. MEMORIAL BRIDGE

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF SOUTHAVEN GOVERNING AUTHORITIES AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, Senator George E. Guerieri, Sr. was a respected member of the Mississippi Senate for 12 years from 1980 to 1992 and was known as a leader of men. He was a highly decorated Retired United States Army Officer and served in WWII, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, as well as in the Office of the Chief of Staff of the Army at the Pentagon in Washington, D.C. Decorations include the Army Legion of Merit and the Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Silver Star, among many other commendations.

WHEREAS, the City of Southaven Governing Authorities ("City") does hereby desire to name that bridge which is a part of Highway 302/Goodman Road, Southaven, DeSoto County, which spans Interstate 55, as the George E. Guerieri Sr. Memorial Bridge in honor and recognition of the many contributions and sacrifices of Senator Guerieri, Sr.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the City does request the Mississippi Legislature to enact legislation naming that bridge which is a part of Highway 302, Southaven, DeSoto County, which spans Interstate 55 as the George E. Guerieri Sr. Memorial Bridge as set forth in the proposed legislation attached hereto as Exhibit A.

CITY OF SOUTHAVEN

Alderman Payne read the following accomplishments of Senator Guereri, Sr.:

Senator E. Guerieri, Sr. was a respected member of the Mississippi State Senate for 12 years from 1980 to 1992 and was known as a leader of men. He was a highly decorated retired United States Army Officer and served WWII, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, as well as in the Office of the Chief of Staff of the

army at the Pentagon in Washington D.C. Decorations include the Army Legion of Merit and Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Silver Star, among many others.

Senator Guereri authored the very first State Racketeering laws in the country and was recognized by President Ronald Reagan for such. He served 4 ½ years on the Desoto County Planning Commission, serving 2 years as the Chairman. He was an advocate for the Baptist Desoto Hospital and the MS State Veteran's homes. Senator Guereri recognized the potential growth of Goodman Road / Hwy 302 and pushed for a nine-lane bridge over I-55 instead of a five-lane bridge. He also served as chairman of the Military Order of World Wars' Memphis Chapter and the President of the Southaven Rotary Club as well as President of Christ King Catholic Church's Parish Council and Knights of Columbus.

Item # 1 Application by IDI Gazeley for subdivision approval of Stateline Business Park North lot 3 on the north side of Stateline Road, east of Tchulahoma Road

Mrs. Choat-Cook stated that the applicant is requesting a subdivision approval for Stateline Park North Phase II lot 3 on the north side of Stateline Road, east of Tchulahoma Road. The lot encompasses 19.77 acres and is located just east of the existing Stateline Business Park North Lot 2. This section of the park is part of an overall master plan that was approved in 2006. The widening and dedication of fifty three (53) feet of right of way for Stateline Road was previously recorded in a separate plat. This plat, which shows the buildable lot, is also identifying several easements including a storm water detention area along the eastern property line, an existing twenty (20) feet easement along Stateline Road and a fifteen (15) foot access / drainage easement on the southwest corner of the lot. This is the final lot approved as part of the Stateline Road Planned Business Park. The remaining property between this lot and Tchulahoma Road was excluded from the project and was left as office zoning. The lot should share access with the adjacent lot within the park. There will not be a bond letter or credit associated with this plat since the improvements for Stateline Road have already been completed prior to the project. All site plan and design review for the new building will be required to go through formal review process. Alderman Hale made the motion to approve the application. Motion was seconded by Alderman Gallagher.

Item # 2 Application by Fasil Kedebe for subdivision approval of Rasco Farms Section "B" on the south side of Stateline Road, east of Horn Lake Road

Mrs. Cook stated that the applicant is requesting subdivision approval for Rasco Farms Section "B" on the south side of Stateline Road, east of Horn Lake Road. This section contains 16 lots with a minimum lot size of 6,000 sq. ft. The overall PUD encompasses approximately 130 acres; this section, which has 3.767 acres, is located in the northwest corner of the overall site and connects with the existing

stub out roads – Mary Ellen Drive and Kathryn Grace Drive. There is a newly proposed access into the subdivision with this section off of Stateline Road. This application is designed in line with the overall master plan that was approved in 2007. The applicant will be required to provide some form of entrance signage on the Stateline Road access and have it identified as an easement for lots one (1) and sixteen (16). If an HOA fails to maintain the area, then it will require that those property owners maintain the space. This note will be placed on the plat as well as their individual deed documents. A subdivision agreement and letter of credit will be required for the new roads prior to platting the subdivision. Pending the applicant can comply, staff recommends approval. Alderman Hale made the motion to approve. Motion was seconded by Alderman Kelly.

Thanksgiving - Thursday, November 24 and 25<sup>th</sup> Christmas - Monday, December 26 New Year's - Monday January 2nd


#### Veteran's Appreciation Luncheon


#### City Entrance Signs


Mayor Musselwhite stated that the first City entrance sign was installed today on Airways north of Stateline Road and encouraged everyone to drive by and look at it. Mayor Musselwhite stated that the City will gradually put these signs in eighteen (18) locations in the City. The two post signs will be placed in some of the higher profile areas and the one (1) post signs will be placed in locations with

less traffic. Mayor Musselwhite thanked Whitney Choat-Cook for all of her hard work, as well as CPC in Jackson for helping the City with the design of the signs. Mayor Musselwhite stated that these signs are huge for the City as far as setting us apart with our beautification efforts. Additionally, the basic green MDOT signs at the arterial intersections will be replaced with a black and white sign that has the City logo on the top. Decorative stop signs will be installed in original Southaven at Northwest Drive, May Boulevard, and on Snowden Lane near the amphitheatre. These will be dual-purpose signs with street names on them as well.










#### Pedestrian Friendly Update

Mayor Musselwhite stated that the City has been planning for the last three years and joined the Memphis-Metro plan "Greenprint 2015/2040" to cooperate with a

larger-scale plan to improve the entire metropolitan area.

Mayor Musselwhite stated that he was excited to announce the beginning of the city's first formal plan to add bike lanes and pedestrian paths and start connectivity to "Greenprint 2015/2040". This new plan will begin within weeks to add bike lanes on Greenbrook Pkwy and Clarington Drive that will connect with a short multi-use trail that further connects with Central Park. This project will eventually connect with another leg of our plan, which is the MDOT-funded multi-use trail that will connect Central and Snowden Grove Parks and is planned to be under construction in 2017. We also have two other pending projects that are pending MDOT funding that should begin in 2017 as well. The "Carriage Hills Pedestrian Project" will add sidewalks throughout the Carriage Hills subdivision, which will help walkability for all of the school traffic in that area. The "Main Street Pedestrian Project" will add sidewalks along Main Street from Highway 51 to City Hall on Northwest Drive. This project will also include new mast arm traffic signals with pedestrian functions at Main/51 and Main/Whitworth.

The bike/pedestrian lane markings of this first phase of our plan are estimated to cost about \$75,000 and will be funded entirely by the City from our general fund "Street Improvement" budget line item.
